COMPETITION RULES:

- Dogs may run only once per division
- Handlers may enter multiple dogs
- If a dog handles they will be eliminated from the competition
- In Advanced or Hunter, white coat or hunt test gunners can be used, along with hidden guns. This is the judge's choice. Puppies will be white coat only
- · All marks will be on land
- Duck call, shot and throw for Puppy division
- Shot and Throw for Hunters and Advanced division
- Marks must be delivered back to the line
- No talking to the dog after the mark is called for
- Dogs will be released by the judges
- Controlled breaks will be allowed
- No re-lining of the dog after the Mark is thrown
- PUPPY & HUNTER DIVISION dogs may be gentle restrained
- ADVANCED DIVISION dogs must be steady
- In case of a tie in the advanced division a blind may be run
- In case of a tie in the puppy & hunter division a run off would take place
- Judges decisions are final
- A ribbon ceremony will be held after all division are finished

Purpose: This Seminar has been designed for Judges that have attended the basic one day AKC Hunting Test Seminar and have attained some judging experience through apprenticeships and/or actual judging. This Seminar is **Open To Anyone** but it does not count as the initial one day AKC Basic Seminar. They cover different subject matter.

This Seminar has been designed to enhance the Retriever Hunting Test Program by assuring the regulations and guidelines, test requirements are understood and are being met. Also, that the standards for all levels of testing are being maintained through fully knowledgeable Judges

Soon the snow will be gone and it will be much easier to get out and train. I've got a young dog that needs to finish up her yard work and get into the field. I am sure we are all ready to be rid of the freezing temps and inches of snow on the ground, so we can get out to train our canine partners.

Spring Clean-up/Work Day

The Spring Clean-up/Work Day will be on Saturday, April 9th following our regularly scheduled monthly meeting. The meeting will begin at 10 AM and the work day will follow immediately afterwards.

We appreciate the efforts of a number of club members that have routinely performed various maintenance and cleanup duties throughout the winter months. But a thorough "Spring Cleaning" is in order. Many hands make light work and the work will only take a few hours, if that. Some of the projects include a very thorough cleaning of our clubhouse facility, cleaning the shed, general cleanup of brush in the yard, around the campers, roads and fields. We have many events scheduled for the spring and summer and this will be a good opportunity for club members to gather and "dress up" the club grounds for the spring. Bring chainsaw, brush saws, limb loppers and such for trimming brush. 4 wheelers and trailers to haul brush to the brush pile would be needed as well.

• <u>CMRC Junior Hunter Seminar</u>: Due to the success of last year's seminar, we are offering it again this year, thanks to the help of a number of our experienced amateur handler club members. Limited to 12 handler/dog teams, the event filled in fewer than two days. We look forward to welcoming a number of new members to our club and the retriever sports through this seminar.

Facebook is a great resource for information on upcoming retriever events throughout the state. Check out our own CMRC Facebook page, the Greater Minnesota Hunt Test Association (GMHTA) Facebook page and the Facebook pages of other clubs for details on their events.

We will again be offering "Club Nights" on Wednesday evenings this spring and summer. This will be an open training group and we welcome everyone to join on Wednesday evenings. This is a great opportunity for our members to meet and get to know each other, give/receive some pointers, and enjoy the comradery of our club. We will broadcast more on "Club Nights" as we near the start date.

Remember, you as a club member have access to the grounds 7 days a week. Be mindful of licensed events happening on the grounds. Generally speaking, training is not allowed on the grounds 24 hours prior to a licensed event, so as to not interfere with test setups.

Finally, as you begin to use the grounds this spring, be mindful to leave the grounds in better condition than they were when you found them. Don't leave any trash behind, be sure to pick up all of your training gear, bumpers and birds (tie-out stakes make a big mess of our mowers), and be careful to limit your driving to areas where you won't do damage. The fields get very wet in the spring and there have been some significant ruts made when people decide to go off the roads. Do not dispose of any dead birds in the garbage dumpster! If you have dead birds you want to get rid of, take them home and dispose of them or use the bird tube (if you don't know where that is, ask).
